AMENDED ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY WAIVERS FROM NMPRC TRANSPORTATION RULES 18.3.4.12.C.9 NMAC, 18.3.14.11.A NMAC AND 18.3.8.11 NMAC

THIS MATTER comes before the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission ("Commission") upon the April 8, 2020 Recommendation filed by Transportation Division Staff ("Staff") recommending that the Commission grant all certificated ambulance service carriers a temporary waiver from 18.3.4.12(C)(9) NMAC, 18.3.14.11(A) NMAC and grant all motor carriers a variance from 18.3.8.11 NMAC¹ during the public health emergency resulting from the COVID-19 epidemic; wherefore, being duly advised in the premises,

THE COMMISSION FINDS AND CONCLUDES:

- 1. The Recommendation requested that that the Commission grant all certificated ambulance service carriers a temporary waiver from 18.3.4.12(C)(9) NMAC, 18.3.14.11(A) NMAC and 18.3.8.11 NMAC during the public health emergency resulting from the COVID-19 epidemic.
 - 2. As grounds for a temporary waiver of 18.3.4.12(C)(9) 2 NMAC, the

² **18.3.4.12 C. Qualifications of drivers other than drivers of small passenger vehicles.** This rule adopts by reference only the following specific sections of Title 49, Part 391 of the Code of Federal Regulations:...(9) medical examinations; certificate of physical examination: Section 391.43, except that for volunteer drivers of ambulance services only, the medical examiner (as defined in 49 CFR Section 390.5) performing the medical examination shall perform a medical examination sufficient to enable the medical examiner

Recommendation asserted that many of the certificated ambulance service carriers' staff will

have their DOT physicals expire and students that will be graduating will need DOT physicals

during this crisis but be unable to schedule non-emergency physicals during the public health

emergency. A temporary waiver from having a medical physical certificated during the public

health emergency would allow current and newly graduated EMS operators that may be unable

to acquire a medical physical certificate during the public health emergency to continue to be

employed by ambulance service providers and provide service to their communities without the

fear of having to suspend drivers.

3. As grounds for the request for a temporary waiver of the requirements set forth in

18.3.14.11(A) NMAC³, Staff asserted that many ambulance service providers, during the public

health emergency are experiencing a combination of limited resources, staff shortage, and also

are trying to minimize exposure risk to COVID-19 during the public health emergency.

Therefore, Staff is requesting a temporary waiver from the requirement that there be two

Emergency Medical Technician ("EMT") for all emergency transports and to allow ambulance

service carriers, during the public health emergency, to provide emergency transports with one

EMT instead of two for all emergency transports.

4. As grounds for the request for a temporary waiver of the requirements set forth in

to certify, in accordance with Subsection C of 18.19.5.33 NMAC, whether or not the driver has a condition that may interfere with the safe operation of an ambulance.....

³ 18.3.14.11 MINIMUM PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS: A. Ambulances. (1)

A minimum of two (2) licensed EMTs from the ambulance service shall be present at the scene of the emergency, except that two (2) EMTs need not be present at the scene for prearranged transfers of a stable patient or in those unusual situations where there are overlapping calls, disasters, or similar unforeseen circumstances which result in an insufficient number of EMTs being available. (2) A minimum of one (1) EMT shall be in the patient compartment at all times during patient care and transport.

18.3.8.11 NMAC⁴, the Recommendation states that many motor carriers currently issued a

permit, certificate or warrant have informed the Transportation Division that they are

experiencing financial hardship dues to a decrease in revenues generated during the Department

of Health's 03-23-2020 Public Health Emergency Order recommending New Mexico citizens to

Stay-At-Home and the corresponding decreased need for public transportation. According to the

Recommendation, many motor carriers may not be able to afford appropriate insurance coverage

and, therefore, may need to apply to the Transportation Division Director requesting approval to

voluntarily suspend their services during the public health emergency and for this reason, Staff

requested that the Commission waive the filing fee(s) required to apply for a temporary

voluntary suspension and/or reinstatement after voluntary suspension⁵.

5. The Recommendation stated that Staff discussed the matter with Mr. Kyle

Thornton, Bureau Chief of the Department of Health's EMS Bureau, the Commission's technical

advisor on ambulance standards⁶ who stated that he supports granting the waiver of these rules

during this crisis.

6. Lastly, Staff recommended the Commission granting the requested waivers to

⁴ **18.3.8.11 A. VOLUNTARY SUSPENSION OF A CERTIFICATE OR PERMIT: A. Application.** An applicant for voluntary suspension shall file: 1) an application on the form prescribed by the director; 2) copies of its current certificate or permit and all endorsements it seeks to suspend; 3) a statement explaining: (a) why such

voluntary suspension is not adverse to the public interest, including whether any other motor carrier is capable of providing the service; and (b) if applicable, why the applicant is not fit, willing, and able to render reasonably continuous and adequate service for the period of time for which voluntary suspension is requested; **B. Application.** An applicant for reinstatement following voluntary suspension shall file: (1) an application on the form prescribed by the director; (2) a copy of the application for voluntary suspension approved by the director; and; (3) a statement

of the changes in circumstances and evidence that the applicant is fit, willing, (4) the period of time for which the applicant seeks to suspend service; and (5) the fee required by NMSA 1978 Section 65-2A-36.

continue for at least 45 days after the Governor rescinds the 03-23-2020 State of Public Health

Emergency Order directing New Mexico citizens to Stay-At-Home, as subsequently extended

and amended.

7. Finally, Staff recommended that the Commission waive the technical

requirements of 1.2.2.40 (A) and (B) NMAC, such that the request be in the form of a petition

and accompanied by an affidavit, so that it may grant a waiver based upon the Recommendation

filed in the docket. 7

8. The Commission finds that it may, in its discretion, waive or vary any

requirement of its Motor Carrier Rules if the Commission finds that such waiver or variance

would be in the public's health, welfare, and safety interests.

9. Based upon the reasons set forth in Staff's Recommendation, the Commission

finds that it is in the public's health, welfare, and safety interests to grant the requested waivers

because they will enable allow certificated ambulance service carriers in the state of New

Mexico to continue providing emergency ambulance transports thus benefitting the residents of

the State during the current public health emergency and allow all motor carriers to file an

application with the Transportation Division Director requesting approval to voluntarily suspend

and apply for re-instatement after voluntary suspension, of their permits, warrants or certificates,

without immediately paying the application fee required by Section 65-2A-36 A. NMSA 1978.

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⁷ 1.2.2.40 NMAC provides that an applicant for a waiver or variance from any transportation rule to submit a written petition, supported by an affidavit, which (1) identifies the section of the rule or order from which the variance is requested; (2) describes the situation that necessitates the variance; (3) describes the effect of complying with the rule or order on the applicant if the variance is not granted; (4) describe the result the variance will have if granted, and (5) describe how the proposed alternative will achieve the purpose of the rule, and why it is in the

public interest.

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10. Further, the Commission finds that granting the requested waivers is consistent

with NMSA 1978, §65-6-4(B)(2) of the Motor Carrier Act which provides: "In establishing

standards for ambulances... the commission shall take into consideration the resources of the

various communities, institutions and sponsoring organizations providing ambulance service to

the public."

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

A. Temporary waivers from Motor Carrier Rules 18.3.4.12(C)(9) NMAC, and

18.3.14.11(A) NMAC are hereby granted to all certificated ambulance providers from the date of

this Order until 45 days after the Governor of the State of New Mexico rescinds the 03-23-2020

Public Health Emergency Order directing New Mexico citizens to Stay-At-Home, as

subsequently extended and amended.

B. A temporary waiver from 18.3.8.11 NMAC is hereby granted to all motor carriers

that possess Commission approved certificates, warrants and/or permits so that they are allowed

to file an application with the Transportation Division Director requesting approval to voluntarily

suspend their operations and to apply reinstatement after voluntary suspension without

immediately paying the Section 65-2A-36 (A) NMSA 1978 required application fees until 45

days after the Governor of the State of New Mexico rescinds the 03-23-2020 Public Health

Emergency Order directing New Mexico citizens to Stay-At-Home, as subsequently extended

and amended.

C. This Order is effective immediately.

D. This Order shall be served and noticed by the Transportation Division Director by

posting a copy on the commission's internet web site and sending electronic mail to all motor

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carriers, public officials or agencies, or other persons or entities who have previously supplied

electronic mail addresses to the commission for the purpose of publication, advising such

persons of the filing and posting.

E. The Transportation Division Director shall immediately notice all motor carriers

that the temporary waivers granted herein will expire in 45 days, using the method set forth in

Decretal Paragraph D., as soon as the Governor of the State of New Mexico rescinds the 03-23-

2020 Public Health Emergency Order directing New Mexico citizens to Stay-At-Home, as

subsequently extended and amended.

F. The Transportation Division is hereby granted variances from Procedural Rule

1.2.2.40 which normally would otherwise require the filing of a petition and an affidavit in

support of the request for a variance from Motor Carrier Rules.
